

Child Welfare Caseworker-30 Days to Family Kinship Specialist

Franklin County Children is seeking a Child Welfare Caseworker- Kinship Specialist. The employee performs specialized child welfare casework that includes locating kinship substitute care settings for youth in agency custody using the 30 Days to Family Model. They assist the agency to achieve CFSR standards and ensure service delivery that focuses on the safety, permanency, and well-being of families receiving services by the agency. The employee is committed to practicing cultural competence by working respectfully and effectively with people of all cultures, classes, races, genders, ethnic backgrounds, religions, sexual orientations, mental and physical abilities, ages and appearances. They do so in a manner that recognizes, affirms and values the worth of individuals, families and communities and protects and preserves the dignity of each. They will adhere to the agency's guiding principles by serving as a child welfare professional, valuing every child, honoring families, and valuing partnerships.

This is a two year grant funded position.
