## NEW SCREENING GUIDELINES

New screening guidelines and a new model for assessing the safety of children are now in place at Franklin County Children Services.

During the summer of 2007, the Agency implemented CAPMIS, the comprehensive assessment and planning model—interim solution, which affects decision-making from the time a child or family is referred and throughout the life of the case. This model helps Children Services workers better protect and care for children who are unsafe, and avoid intervening in the lives of families where parents are able to protect their children.

Professionals who report suspected abuse or neglect may see differences in how the Agency handles their calls and in how services are provided. Tools for assessing the safety of children and timeframes for providing services have also changed.

Time is built into the training for questions and activities. This training meets the requirements that many professionals have for child abuse training.

## TRAINING OPPORTUNITIES

Franklin County Children Services provides free training for professionals who are mandated to report child abuse and neglect.
